1) GENERAL ITEMS (Tim McGrath for President Luster)

- a) Welcome (Members absent: Cherie Deogracias, John Crocitti, Pam Luster attending ACCJC Workshop.)
- b) Consent Agenda Approval no major events submitted for approval.
- c) District-Wide Updates: Tim shared that the Chancellor's Cabinet reviewed the Board of Trustees agenda for 2-9-12. Robin Watkins will attend and be recognized as the SDCCD Classified Employee of the Year candidate to be submitted to the California Community Colleges Chancellor's office.

2) COLLEGE-WIDE PLANNING – PIE Committee (Tim McGrath)

a) Update – The PIE committee held a retreat last Friday where they reviewed past institutional goals and objectives. President Luster and the new campus-based researcher, Brianna Hays, attended and gave input on what data Mesa is measuring and needs to measure. The PIE Committee will provide ongoing updates to the President's Cabinet.

3) INSTRUCTION (Tim McGrath)

- a) Enrollment Update:
- Mesa is offering 164 fewer sections this year compared to spring 2011. (72 Census classes)
- As a district we are offering 515 fewer sections this year compared to last spring.
- Mesa is down 58 FTES from last year. (32 FTES in census classes)
- Summer 2011 = 68.2
- Fall 2011 = 7,269.8
- Spring 2012 = 7,684
- Projected Total 15, 022
- Headcount is down 1,074 students from last year which is a 4% drop.
- 26,135 = spring 2011
- 25,061 = spring 2012
- Fill Rates (Both on campus and online) are a combined 93% which is 1% higher than last year's rate of 92% at this time
- Enrollment Capacity (total seats on campus and online)
- 64,029/69,193 = spring 2011 = 91%

- 62,526/66,293 = spring 2012 = 93.7%
- Load Factor
- 548 = spring 2011
- 568 = spring 2012
- *Based on 557 load factor for 16.5 semester
- 525 = 17.5 semester

4) STUDENT SERVICES (Brian Stockert, Interim VPSS)

a) Update: Brian reported that Student Services is not experiencing a rush for classes as in the past. Brian attended the Region X Matriculation meeting where it was reported that Mira Costa is the only community college with a full summer session (offering 350 sections.) Grossmont reported they will support preferences for continuing students. A tour for members of President's Cabinet to see the Student Services building will be scheduled.

5) ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES (Ron Perez, VPA)

Ron shared that food service trucks are on a test run at the Modular Village, Design Center and Allied Health locations.

- b) College Police (Diana Medero): Sergeant Medero distributed a handout covering the topics of parking, traffic, mental health and crime. The traffic signals on Linda Vista and Ashford are not in sync and are backing up traffic into Mesa College. The City traffic engineer is monitoring this and Diana will report back on the evaluation. Diana asked the group to please keep the names and codes up to date on our classroom alarm system. Some inactive faculty names on still on the list for classrooms and a key cannot be issued until a code can be available on the classroom list. The problem areas are Modular Village, T 1-2-3, H-200, and K-200. The bookstore recently was victim to theft by an hourly employee. The person was videotaped and a warrant has been issued. Diana reported that campus police have responded to two mental incidents cases of suicide reports appear to be on the rise. She listed her contact numbers on the handout.
- c) Facilities Staff / Schedule Update (Deb Canning): Deb distributed the Facilities Services newsletter for January 2012. She reported that facilities is modifying the second shift to eliminate the third shift in an attempt to save money. Facilities has been piloting first shift cleaning in the LRC which is working well and providing better service to that area. Staff offices will now be cleaned Monday Friday beginning at 3 p.m.; Deb is reviewing the class schedules to find times to be able to clean classrooms between classes if possible. Civic center events will be charged overtime for any events schedule in the evenings or on weekends.

6) PARTICIPATORY GOVERNANCE REPORTS

a) Academic Senate (Madeleine Hinkes): Madeleine stated that the first Academic Senate meeting for the spring semester was held yesterday; Pam Luster was in attendance and reviewed her PowerPoint from the Fall Convocation. A resolution was passed by Academic Senate opposing

Student Success Task Force recommendations on ESOL. The red zone section of the PIE Committee chart was presented. Madeleine also shared that an ASG representative will now be in attendance to Academic Senate meetings this Spring.

- b) Classified Senate (Angela Liewen): First meeting of the Classified Senate will be this Friday.
- c) Associated Students Governance (Cherie Deogracias not present): Ashanti Hands shared that Cheri attended the Student Senate meeting. ASG will be holding in-house elections tomorrow and are currently reviewing committee appointments and assign new representatives if necessary.
