

Special Message March 23, 2020

Colleagues,

We have jumped into what can only be described as a, "grand experiment" created by the necessity as human beings to keep one another alive. We will only know in the next few months what will actually happen, but in the meantime, experiment we must. I'm writing to you today to let you know that we are working very hard behind the scenes to solve real time challenges, and to support you.

I have already volunteered to cover spelling, reading, and PE. I'm grateful that I can share the load, as I know that we have lots of parents and single parents that are doing it all. If you are a caregiver for a spouse or other loved one, we know that the weight of worry is real.

As we navigate this together, I am hopeful that we will find new ways to connect with each other. I have seen virtual happy hours...reading books to children...science experiments...group yoga and so much more that you are all sharing on social media. As you discover what works for you, share it with us on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram or your choice of platforms...or just call each other. Check in, support, and laugh about the absurdity of toilet paper hoarding and now the giant pasta shortage. This is a very serious time, but we do not have to be somber about it 24/7.

Know that your executive administrative team is meeting every morning via Zoom and that the Chancellors Cabinet is meeting regularly. Deans, chairs and - of course - departments are connecting as well. Additionally, the CEO's of all of the San Diego and Imperial Valley Colleges (SDICCCA) are meeting every other day. We are learning from each other and I am grateful for their support and collaboration. Chancellor Oakley at the CCCCO is communicating with us regularly and providing critical operational support. There are a million details that we are working through...grading, transfer, basic needs, supports, facilities, technology, access and so much more. We will be working in real time to solve these issues, and I look forward to communicating with you as we do.

Finally, the most important aspect for me is to promote hope. Our students need for us to be encouraging, helpful and compassionate. I know that you are...I'm hearing from many students that they are already feeling isolated. A message of hope goes a long way, including putting it out there that we are not perfect. All of us are in this together, and I could not be more thankful to be doing it with all of you.
