



Course Outcomes Analysis by Overall between Tutored and Not-tutored



Tutoring in Action

MT2C helped nearly 2,200 students with over 15,700 online tutoring sessions from fall 2020 through fall 2021



Within the Not-tutored:

Low-income students' course success rate was **equal or lower** than Not Low-income students in ENGL101 (FA19).

Within the Tutored:

The course success rates of the low-income students were higher than not-tutored AND not-low-income students.

Note. Not all data points are shown due to data suppression on student groups with fewer count than 10.
