




Please encourage all Fall 2025 Transfer Students to attend a Transfer Talk or make an appointment or come for Drop In if they have questions about their application.

Missed Convocation? Here are some highlights of what was presented:

- People often turn to donations when they are worried how policy may impact their communities. In 2016, the donations to the ACLU rose by 1,000% on Giving Tuesday, \$1.7 million on that day alone.
