7. Discussion Items

1. SSCCC Region X Presentation.

Xtopher "X" Ruiz, representing Region X, announced that a special election will take place this Friday. He explained that the Student Senate for California Community Colleges (SSCCC) works in partnership with ASG but does not have the authority to directly request changes on campus. Instead, the SSCCC advocates for funding of ASG projects, while its delegates attend statewide events, vote in elections, and draft resolutions. X highlighted the various ways students can get involved, such as writing resolutions, joining a caucus, or volunteering for leadership positions. X also emphasized SSCCC's accomplishments, including expanding access to mental health services and making textbooks more affordable, and noted that the organization operates as a nonprofit.

Claudio Nevells: Clarified that a resolution is similar to an essay: it identifies an issue and proposes a solution, which can then move up to become a law. Statewide changes have occurred through resolutions, such as SB 98. Also mentioned Region X's Instagram.

Emilia: Asked whether caucus membership is connected to school or local government.

X: Responded that caucuses must include at least ten members from different schools, not just one.

President Palomino: Will share the SSCCC Instagram and Xtopher's contact information.

2. Thanksgiving Feast, November 20, 2025

Jahnae: The Thanksgiving Feast will be hosted by The Stand and the Culinary Program. Last year, it drew hundreds of attendees and featured free food, including complimentary turkeys. A large number of volunteers will be needed to assist with setup on the day of the event.
