ELIGIBILITY FOR GRADUATION

Note: Students who are following a different catalog year should refer to previous catalogs for graduation requirements and approved courses

- 1. Complete a minimum of 60 semester units (90 quarter units) of degree-applicable lower division credit courses.
- 2. Complete all units required for the major/area of emphasis (a minimum of 18 semester units of course work are required; however, many majors require more than 18 units consult the catalog for specific major course requirements and any recency limitations).
- 3. Complete at least 12 semester units (18 quarter units) in residence within the San Diego Community College District.
- 4. Complete a minimum of 21 units of AA/AS General Education (GE) Requirements courses, with a minimum of one course in each area.
- 5. Complete/satisfy District Requirements courses in addition to AA/AS GE Requirements or see a counselor about other GE options.
- 6. Achieve a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 ("C" average) in the curriculum upon which the degree is based. A grade of "C" or better must be earned in courses required for the major and GE Areas 1A, 1B, and 2; up to 12 units of "P" (pass) grades count for degree.

This requirement is also waived for students who earn degrees in Nursing Education and Physical Therapist Assistant, or are graduates of a certified paramedic training program.
EXERCISE SCIENCE ACTIVITY (formerly Physical Education): Complete two activity courses numbered below Physical Education 240 or Exercise Science 229 or any Dance courses except for Dance 181, 183, & 253. Administration of Justice* 127A-D, 128A-D, 260, 323A, 381, & 382; Fire Protection Technology* 100D, 150A & B, 380W, & 381F; and Lifeguarding* 101 & 301 are also acceptable (*MMR)

NOTE: U.S. Veterans and active duty U.S. military personnel with 6 months of continuous service, as well as those who completed basic training, may be granted 1 unit of college credit (0.5 units EXSC 140A and 0.5 units EXSC 140B). Other options are available for students with physical limitations. This requirement is also waived for students with accredited Fire Fighter I certification or graduates of a POST Commission certified regional law enforcement academy.
